Natural Refrigerants

**Speaker Bio:**  
Dr. Zahid Ayub is a local ASHREA member, and an ASHRAE Fellow, with an extensive background in service to ASHRAE on the national level and is currently Chairman of the ASHRAE Natural Refrigerants Position Paper Committee

**Presentation Outline:**  
Driven by international agreements such as the Montreal and Kyoto protocols (UNEP 1999 and United Nations 1998) as well as a desire for a higher degree of sustainability, there is a renewed interest in increasing the application of natural refrigerants. The class of refrigerants commonly referred to as "natural refrigerants" offers the potential to improve the environmental performance of refrigeration systems. Because of its alignment with sustainability initiatives, ASHRAE supports research, assessment, and strategic growth in the use of natural refrigerants such as ammonia, carbon dioxide, hydrocarbons, air and water in refrigeration systems and technologies.


Taking a leadership role means ASHRAE and its members will continue to extend the scope of refrigeration and air conditioning technology by conducting research, disseminating knowledge, developing standards and guidelines, and promoting the responsible use of sustainable refrigerants. Several technical committees within ASHRAE are committed to achieve this goal. Limited research has been undertaken within a few ASHRAE technical committees during the past decade with most efforts focused on ammonia and carbon dioxide. In light of the current global scenario, ASHRAE's response to the demand for environmental sustainability is to promote the development of systems which use natural refrigerants safely, economically and efficiently.



### ASHRAE Recognizes Outstanding HVAC&R Industry Achievements

ORLANDO – Forty-eight people were recognized by ASHRAE for their contributions to the Society and the building industry at the Society's 2010 Winter Conference held here Jan. 23-27.

The **ASHRAE Hall of Fame** honors deceased members of the Society who have made milestone contributions to the growth of HVAC&R technology. The Society inducts Presidential Member **William J. Collins Jr.**, ASHRAE Fellow, who dedicated over half a century to the HVAC&R industry, and **J. Donald Kroeker**, ASHRAE Fellow, a pioneer of heat pump applications, into the ASHRAE Hall of Fame. The **F. Paul Anderson Award**, ASHRAE's highest given for technical achievement, is awarded for notable achievement of outstanding services performed in the HVAC&R field. The recipient is **Gerald C. Groff**, Fellow ASHRAE, Life Member, principal, Groff Associates, Cazenovia, N.Y.
