Attention all licensed Professional Engineers in Texas!

Did you know that the PE license renewal period has been extended to two years? The renewal period used to be each year but has now been extended in order to bring Texas into alignment with the majority of other US states.

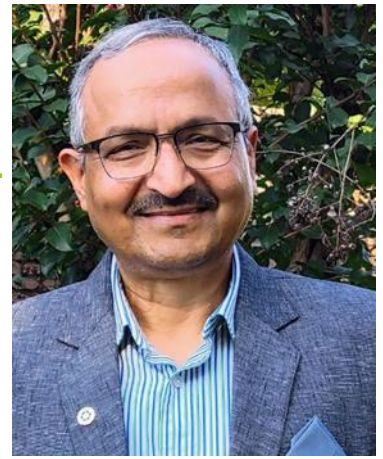
This change came through an act of legislation in the 89th Texas legislative session through the passage of SB 681. The bill's intent was to reduce the regulatory burden on professional engineers, engineering firms and the board staff that process registration renewals. Texas has over 68,000 active professional engineers, which is second only to California.

The new renewal schedule applies to both individual PE license holders and engineering firm licenses, and the effective date started on 9/1/2025. Be sure to confirm your next license renewal date with the [Texas Board of Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors](#).

The 89th Texas legislative session also passed bills impacting engineering licensure for active service military, military veterans and those with previous criminal convictions. Refer to the list of bills at the following hyper-link for additional information.



FROM SOLAR FIELDS TO ASHRAE FELLOW: A CONVERSATION WITH DR. PRADEEP BANSAL



When you sit down with Dr. Pradeep Bansal, you quickly realize you're not just talking to an engineer — you're talking to a storyteller, a mentor, and a global citizen of the HVAC&R world. From the remote opal mining towns of Australia to Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Dr. Bansal's journey is as diverse as it is inspiring.

A Global Career Rooted in Curiosity

Dr. Bansal began his academic journey in India, earning his bachelor's, master's, and PhD before venturing to Australia in 1985. There, he worked on a solar thermal power plant in a region so hot and remote that residents lived underground to escape the 130°F summers — and the snakes.

After Australia, he moved to New Zealand to the University of Auckland. During his time in New Zealand, Dr. Bansal pivoted from solar energy to refrigeration, sparked by a seminar on global warming and refrigerants. That moment led him to ASHRAE in 1990, and eventually to a sabbatical — and later a full-time role — at Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

His research has spanned everything from household appliances to magnetic and thermoelectric refrigeration, and even oil-less compressors for next-gen refrigerators. Most recently, he worked with Energy Solutions in California, helping utilities adopt energy-efficient technologies to avoid building new power plants.

ASHRAE: A Network, a Culture, a Community

Dr. Bansal's ASHRAE involvement has been deep and wide. He's chaired or served on nearly every refrigeration-related Technical Committee (TC), contributed to the Refrigeration Handbook, and served on the Research and Administration Committee (RAC). He's also been a Fellow — and a mentor to new Fellows — helping others navigate the nomination process for ASHRAE's highest honors.

But for Dr. Bansal, the heart of ASHRAE is its people.

"When you go to ASHRAE, it looks like a big show," he said. "Old guys with ties and ribbons down to their knees, hugging each other. At first, it's overwhelming. But once you're part of the culture, you start to love it."

He fondly recalls dinners hosted by chapters from India, China, Malaysia — each one a chance to break bread, share stories, and build lasting friendships. "The freer you are, the more tension you remove. And the friendships are lasting."

Advice for the Next Generation

Dr. Bansal is passionate about mentoring young engineers, especially those feeling uncertain about their career paths. He shared a story about a young woman with a PhD in energy storage who felt lost in her role. After an hour-long conversation, she left motivated and hopeful. “Don’t get lost. Don’t worry too much,” he advises. “Make a plan. Share your experiences. Find a mentor who listens without judgment.”

He also encourages chapters to lift up their members — to nominate them for awards, help them get involved in committees, and guide them toward leadership roles. “These accolades from ASHRAE require participation. We should help each other get there.”

Final Thoughts

Dr. Bansal's story is a reminder that ASHRAE is more than technical papers and standards — it's a community built on shared experiences, mentorship, and a passion for progress. Whether you're a student, a young professional, or a seasoned engineer, there's a place for you in ASHRAE — and people like Dr. Bansal are ready to help you find it.

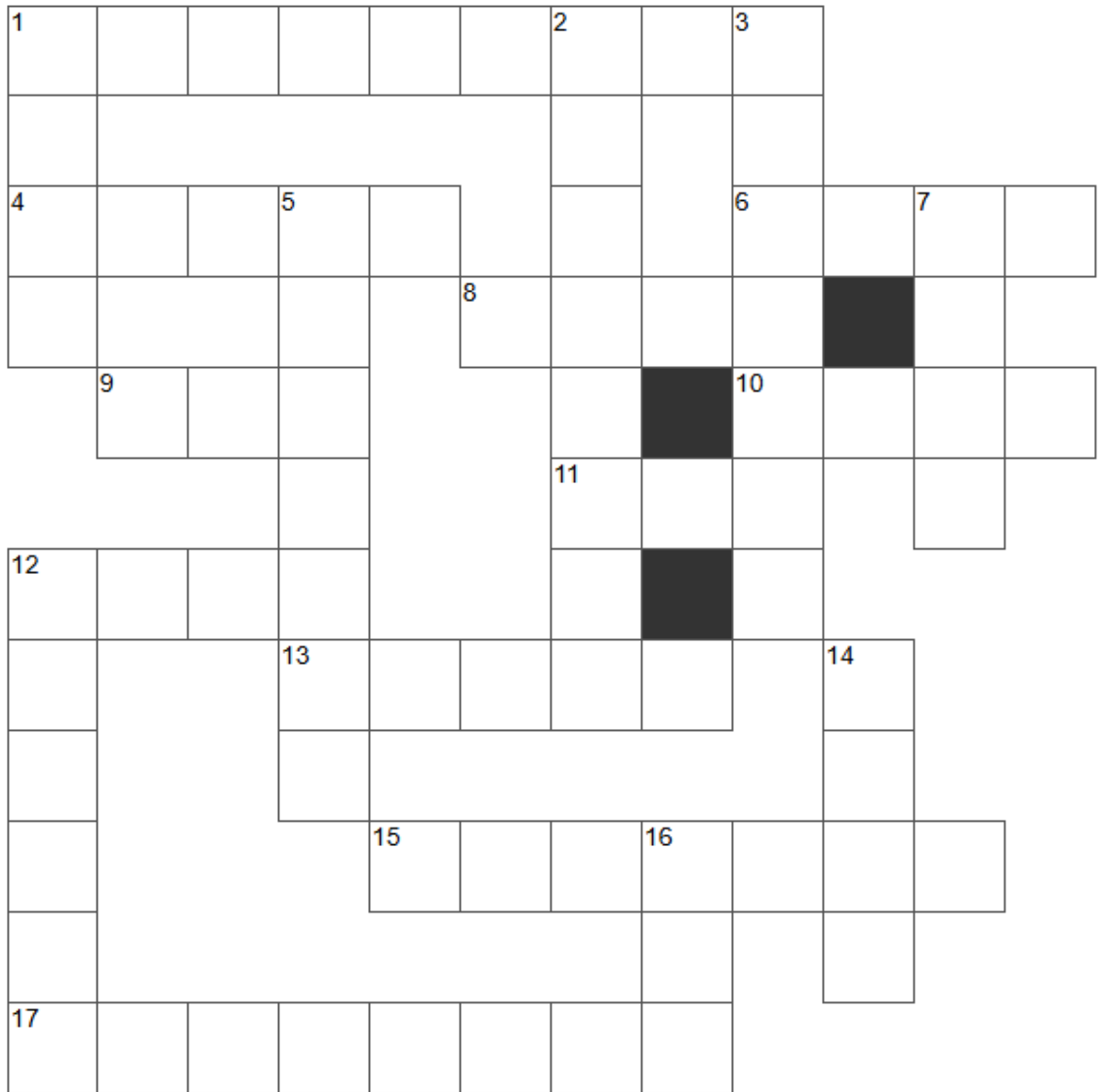
